Dear McFarlin Family,

We hope you will take a few minutes to read this important update to our annual Christmas Offering.

On behalf of the Food Pantry team, we, Karen and Rick, want to express our deep gratitude for how previous Christmas Offerings have generously supported the pantry. During the recent stoppage of SNAP benefits, many families in our community experienced real fear. Yet over \$45,000 was given in just a few weeks, with nearly 20% coming from outside our congregation. That generosity built a strong foundation that will sustain the pantry through 2026.

At the October 5 all-church gathering, we were reminded that the Food Pantry does not stand alone and funding our general McFarlin budget is crucial. We were reminded that our church is growing but has some growing pains. Our beloved church needs about \$200,000 above and beyond regular giving to close a gap for 2025. Because the Pantry fund is healthy and the whole church is important, **the Food Pantry team is "giving back" this year's Christmas Offering to the church's general budget.** We want McFarlin to finish 2025 strong and begin 2026 with momentum, health, and energy. We are not just Food Pantry people. We are McFarlin people, and we invite your participation.
